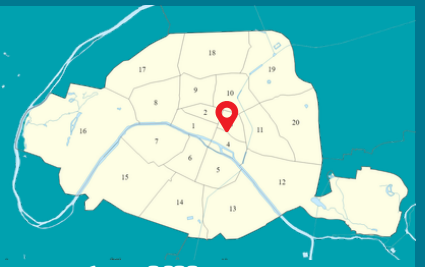

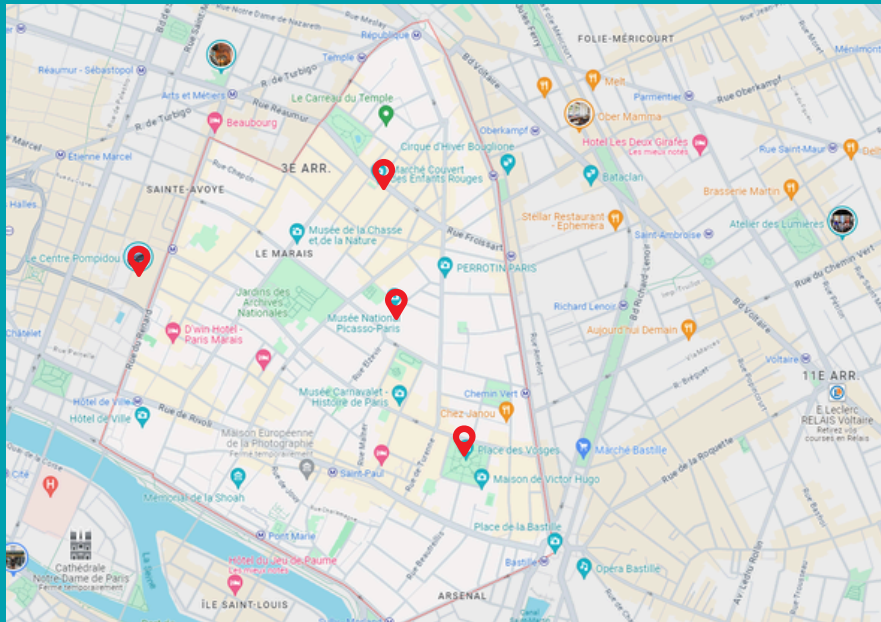


Map of

Le Marais is a historical quarter in the city, full of life since the XII century. Today it's an iconic area of the city, located within the 3rd and 4th arrondissements and home to multiple museums, galleries, bars and shops.



Marché Couverte des Enfants Rouges

39 Rue de Bretagne, 75003 Paris

Created in 1615, this market is the oldest in the city and it's still running today!

Musée National Picasso-Paris

5 Rue de Thorigny, 75003 Paris

Exceptional museum dedicated to the life and art of the father of cubism, Picasso.

Le Centre Pompidou

Place Georges-Pompidou, 75004 Paris

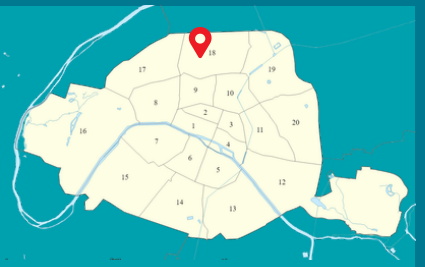
One of the iconic museums in Paris for both modern and contemporary art!

Place des Vosges

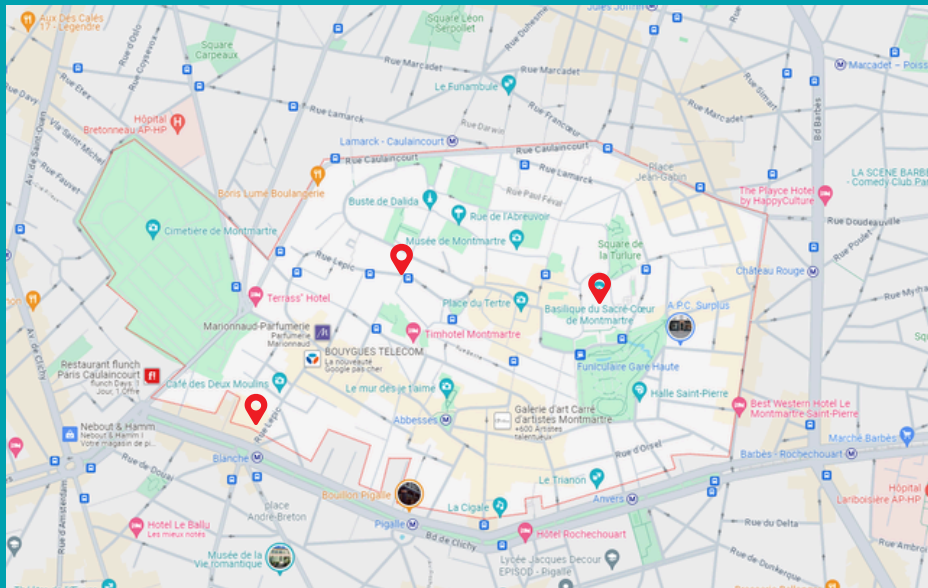
Place des Vosges, 75004 Paris, 75004 Paris

Montmartre



Montmartre is the highest spot in the city, and it's located in the 18th arrondissement. Even if its origins date back to the Antiquity, it's best known for its life during the XIX century, where it was (and still is!) one of the artistic centers of Paris and a gathering place for local artists.



La basilique du Sacré-Cœur

35 Rue du Chevalier de la Barre, 75018 Paris

Built in the late XIX century a neo-romanesque style with Byzantine influences. The hill is a popular spot to *pique-nique* and enjoy the sun!

Le Moulin de la Galette

83 Rue Lepic, 75018 Paris

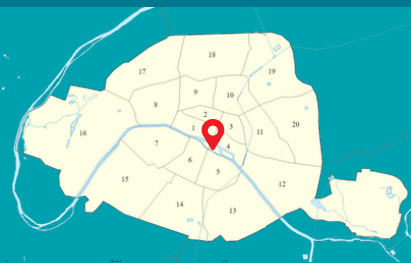
Mostly known for Renoir's iconic painting... Today it is still open as a restaurant!

Le Moulin Rouge

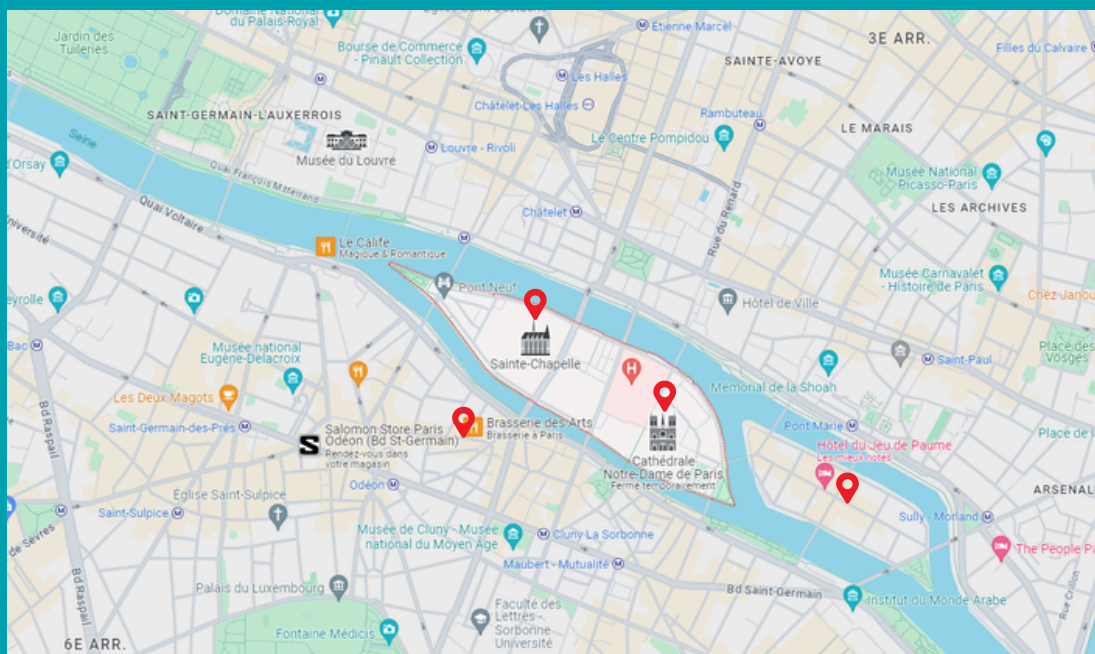
82 Bd de Clichy, 75018 Paris

Take a goûter and walk to Notre-Dame

La Sainte Chapelle

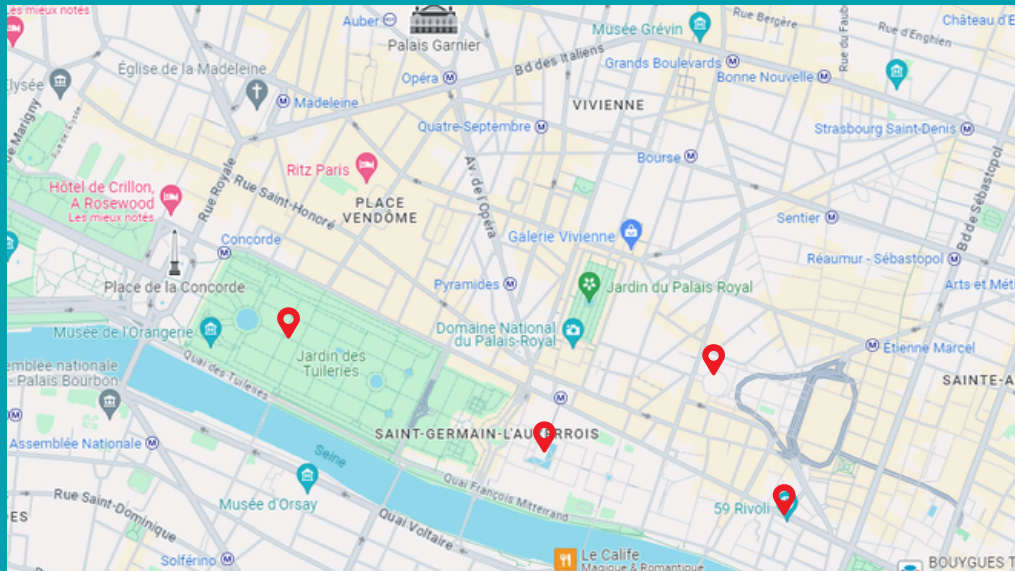
10 Bd du Palais, 75001 Paris

Tuileries

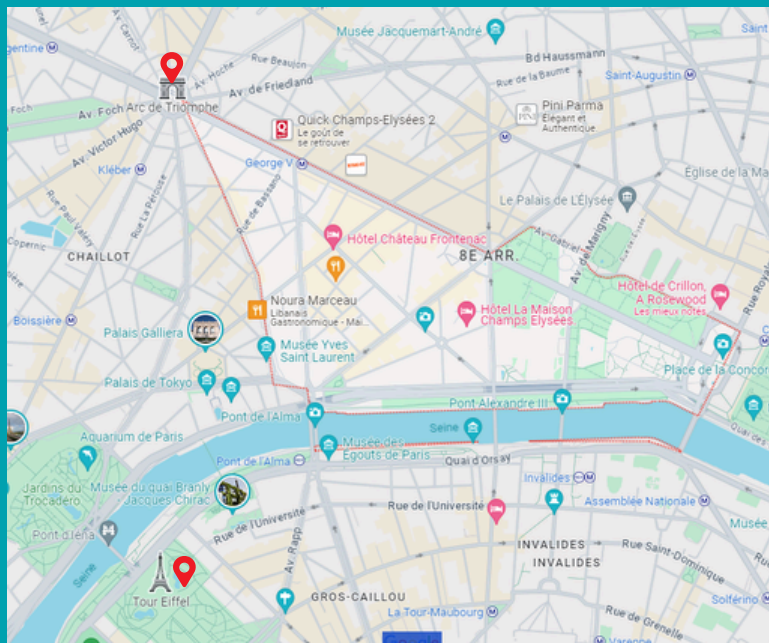

Champs Élysées

Place Charles de Gaulle, 75008 Paris

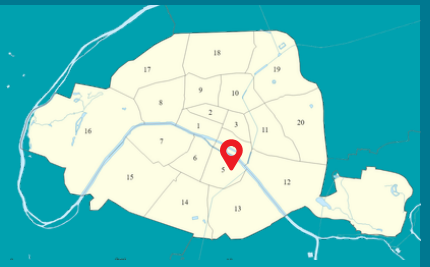
Built under the command of Napoleon, inspired by the Roman arches. Today, the top offers an impressive panoramic view of Paris.

La Tour Eiffel

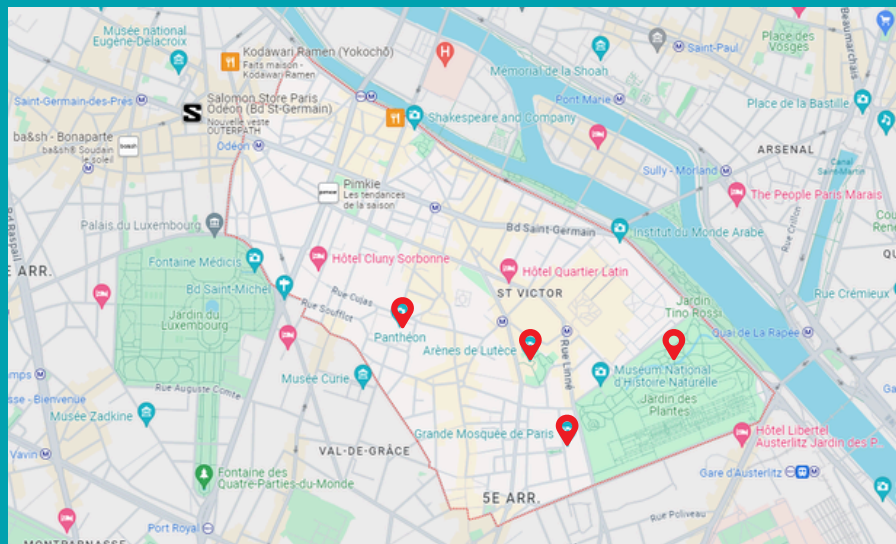
Avenue Gustave Eiffel, 75007 Paris

Built in 1889 for the Universal Exhibition and not well received in its time due to the use of new materials, today it's an undeniable emblem of Paris.

Quartier Latin



Historical quarter in Paris, it received its name from the monasteries and schools settled in this side of the Seine ever since the XIII century, where the main language used was latin.



Panthéon

Place du Panthéon, 75005 Paris

Mausoleum in the neoclassical style located on top of the hill of Sainte-Geneviève.

Jardin des Plantes

75005 Paris

Botanic garden with different species of plants and animals from around the world.

Grande Mosquée de Paris

2bis Place du Puits de l'Ermitte, 75005 Paris

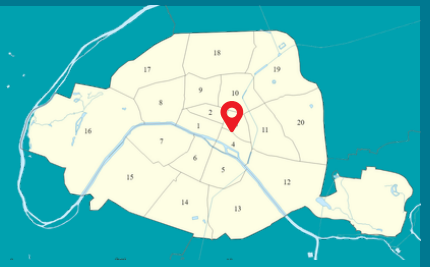
The first mosque built in Metropolitan France in a beautiful hispano-moorish style.

Arènes de Lutèce

49 Rue Mongue, 75005 Paris

Part of an ancient Roman amphitheater now exposed and surrounded by gardens!

Marché Couverte des Enfants Rouges

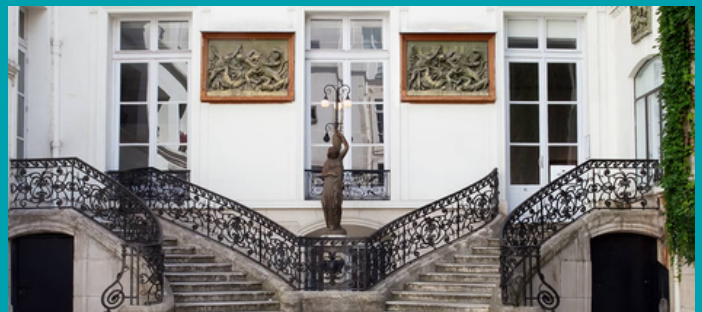
39 Rue de Bretagne, 75003 Paris

Created in 1615, this market is the oldest in the city. Today, they still offer fresh produce stands, restaurants and *traiteurs*. It's a spot for gathering and holds a very special charm. Furthermore, it's open all day, every day (except Mondays)!

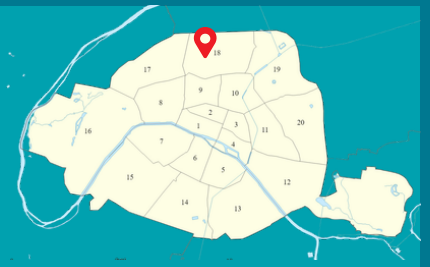


Galleries d'art

Le Marais is a charming area to walk around and discover all its hidden gems. One of the best things about it is the amount of galleries around the neighborhood: Perrotin, Lafayette Anticipations, Galleria Continua, Galerie Sabine Bayasli.... They are always free to enter and often host *vernissages*!

83 Rue Lepic, 75018 Paris

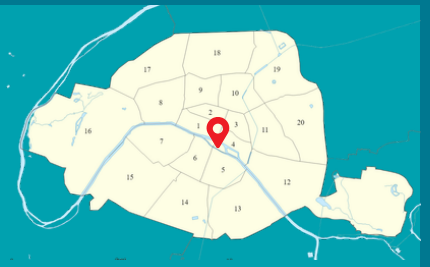
When wandering through Montmartre you will probably stumble upon a gorgeous wooden mill... Le **Moulin de la Galette**. A popular place to gather during the XIX century, mostly known for Renoir's iconic painting... Today it is still open as a restaurant.



And just down the hill on the edge of Montmartre, you will find the iconic **Moulin Rouge** (82 Bd de Clichy 75018) with its famous lights in the Pigalle neighborhood.

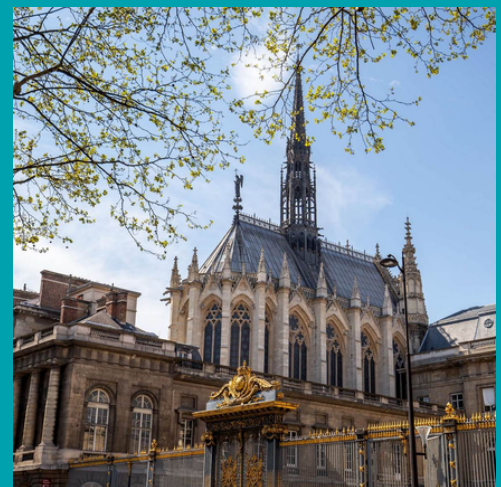

However, it truly is a Gothic jewel, showing the extent to which this artistic style propagated in France, making the walls vanish and the ceilings touch the sky... The picture only shows the exterior so as not to spoil the surprise that awaits you inside!

Le Louvre

75001 Paris

La Bourse de Commerce

If you'd rather see contemporary art, La Bourse de Commerce is the place for you! The pieces belong to the Pinault Collection, making it one of the most avant-garde and cutting-edge contemporary art collections in all Europe.



59 Rivoli

59 Rue de Rivoli, 75001 Paris

59 Rivoli is an artistic residence that hosts up to 30 artists at any given time. Their workshops are always open without reservation. So you can always pop up to see art in the making!



Champs Élysées

Arc de Triomphe

Place Charles de Gaulle, 75008 Paris

The Arc de Triomphe was built under the command of Napoleon, inspired by the Roman arches. However, it wasn't inaugurated until 1836 with the king Louis-Philippe. Today, the top offers an impressive panoramic view of Paris.



La Tour Eiffel

Avenue Gustave Eiffel, 75007 Paris

Walking down from the Arc de Triomphe, you will reach the Tour Eiffel, also known as the iron lady and the symbol of the city. It was built in 1889 for the Universal Exhibition that marked the 100 year anniversary of the French Revolution. As much as it wasn't well received in its time due to the use of new materials, today it's an undeniable emblem of Paris.
